PAM-DBKL Architectural Ideas Competition in Designing Temporary Shelters for the KL Homeless

INTRODUCTION

This Architectural Open Ideas Competition, titled “PAM-DBKL Architectural Ideas Competition 2014 in designing temporary shelters for the KL Homeless”, is initiated by the Pertubuhan Akitek Malaysia (PAM) Committee for Urban Wellbeing Housing and Government Liaison and the Dewan Bandaraya Kuala Lumpur (DBKL). It is an Open Ideas Competition to all PAM members and other relevant profession.

OBJECTIVE OF THE COMPETITION

Kuala Lumpur (KL) has seen rapid economic growth in recent years and this has indirectly resulted in the increase of the cost of living in the city. To some KL urbanites who are earning meagre income and irregular income, it has become increasingly challenging even to rent a space to call a night and rest after a day's work or activity. Many end up on the streets, living under bridges and public spaces.

Their daily needs, are sometimes provided, subsidised and assisted by the DBKL and several caring Non-Governmental Organisations, but these on-going assistance currently seemed not well structured or organised. DBKL has been providing temporary shelters in the city, but will soon not be sufficient as the number of homeless is on the rise. Various 'Soup Kitchens' can only do so much in providing food and other daily needs as they are merely charitable organisation that operates solely from donations and volunteers.

Housing the homeless is not about creating permanent homes for the less fortunate. It is more of creating a conducive transient shelter that could provide the much needed communal temporary relief for the homeless. The design of these temporary shelters should not compromise on the quality of the product or construction techniques. Instead, it should provide good creature comfort, low construction work force requirement to construct, easy and low maintenance and good usage of sustainable building material, environmentally friendly and low energy, durable and capable of lasting. It should definitely test new boundaries of architectural design.

The objective of this ideas competition is also to promote the Malaysian architect fraternity ability in designing for social needs and dispel the general public notion that architects only serve the elites.





TITLE : KL STEP INN - Temporary Lodging for the Urban Homeless


DESCRIPTION

Using the approach used by the homeless who adopt steps and benches as a platform for them to rest, this shelter expands the idea into a shared communal space elevated from the streets for live, play and rest. These steps are designed to be open and welcoming in providing the needed respite for the homeless on their road to self-recovery. The overall shelter design is based on the principle of 'transient living' where it combines the flexibility of construction scaffolding and flat pack panels with the mobility of street furniture. Made from renewable and recyclable materials; and able to generate its own energy and water, KL Step Inn will allow the homeless to lightly tread the everyday rigours of urban life.




DEVELOPMENT OF IDEA

Steps and elevated planes are commonly used as platform for the homeless to rest. Steps are amplified as vertical movement, a subtle shift from current state of condition.



Steps become space for gathering and engaging with others.



Living pods for resting and privacy help contain the common space and shape the main circulatory spine. External pockets of space become opportunity for makeshift uses.



DESCRIPTION

The Shelter will provide and protect the homeless population and motivate them to lift their spirits and confidence in the hope of changing their situation.

Lively and bright spaces are provided coupled with ease of interaction with charitable volunteer groups running the Shelter. The emphasis is not just on the buildings alone, but also on the spaces created in between them, giving the perception of enclosure which heightens the feeling of community and security.

The planning derives from a study and analyses of possible Shelter activities. Four modules of accomodation are created to incorporate those activities. These are linked to each other by circulation walkways around a Central Energy Tower which houses both the main water tank ,rainwater harvesting tank and solar panels located at the highest point. The outdoor spaces in between modules are also designed to complement the activites within each module.

At night the Central Energy Tower also acts as a beacon for the homeless.

TITLE : A Place To Rest Your Back


DESCRIPTION

Taking the cue from the backbone – the most important structure in human anatomy that deserves a decent horizontal plane or even a comfortable mattress especially for those without a place called home - we extracted the concept for our scheme.

Its structures are regular and modulated – functionally and simplistically it is a circulation corridor for 'the fiber-optic-equivalent' of our nerve system.

Here the spine/backbone of the scheme reinvents itself as the main circulation route for the rooms it serves – the classic concept of the servant and the served (master-spaces) as professed by Louis Kahn.

From the urban context the spine is also a threshold separating the hustle-bustle of the city from the oasis-like shelter - both physically by its construction with the DBKL billboards conveniently clipped onto it and indirectly shielding the stigma of the occupants from the sight of busy city dwellers.



DESCRIPTION

Camp KL addresses the urban issue of homeless habitants in the city. Instead of gathering the homeless in a house which lacks a sense of belonging, this project proposes an alternative solution, to design a space with the theme 'communal'. There are 3 aspects to this, namely: 'Communal Building', 'Communal Planting' and 'Communal Interaction'.

Derived from a modular system, there are 3 types of spaces a shelter serves - 'bedroom', 'communal' & 'services'. The proposed modular of 5m x 5m structure once combined, forms a light weight global system which is fast to assemble and easy to deconstruct. The tension membrane roof forming the shelter is not only generic to accommodate various activities but also specific enough to function as a living space. Its flexible typology allows freedom in arranging the modules, enabling it to expand or to reduce its overall area.





DESCRIPTION

The Leaf blossomed from the idea of creating temporary shelter in the midst of tropical oasis surrounded by concrete jungle of KL metropolis. The metaphor is articulated using the forces of a shaded tree with wide-spread leaf that traditionally used as a shelter from excessive heat of the climate. Using tree as a generator, The Leaf is industrialized to become a sanctuary for groups of homeless that seeking shelter to live themselves from a hectic life of urban. Incorporation of synthesizes with natural cross ventilation to reduce energy building usage and to promote relaxing environment, The Leaf also emphasized from prefabricated building components invented from recyclable materials that easily dismantle for sustainable purposes. The Leaf becomes a haven for the homeless for self-conceptualization and self-generation that will contribute positively to community.

TITLE : From Homeless To Homeliness


DESCRIPTION

The design tends to derive 'Homeless to Homeliness' in a holistic manner that seek enrichment and life quality improvement of the homeless.

Through a sensible zoning and spatial arrangement, the homeless can eventually have their moment of privacy, social interaction and to an extent able to generate certain income through an augmentation program by collecting and sorting waste materials in a more systematic and efficient way.

With the use of lightweight, recycle composite material, each cubical can be dismantled and relocated easily. Crossed ventilation, rain water harvesting system and photovoltaic cells are part of the design features to cover some of the basic needs for water and electricity in a sustainable manner.


Providing a temporary shelter for the homeless will ease the access to them by the government agencies and NGOs so they can get regular medical care and eventually become able to get back on their feet.







DESCRIPTION


Using the concept "Epiphyte", the design intends to create opportunities for meaningful partial self-sustainable activities for the homeless communities through architecture, while fulfilling design requirements with voluntary simplicity thru the following approach:

Recycled art-inspired architecture ensures shelter aesthetic integrity while offer low cost, low tech and easy to maintain solution where flooring, roofing, partitioning and furniture are from reusable and recyclable materials which occupants can source and replace easily building maintenance.

Modular and lightweight structural members with simplistic construction detailing allow various building layout and easy assembly by people with semi-professional construction skills. (volunteers, occupants themselves)

Low tech vertical bottle farm offers meaningful engagement of daily activity by homeless community on their own food production that can be supplied to soup kitchens as means to reduce their operating costs, or sell to surrounding communities. The shelter is able to cater a total of 24 occupants at one time.


TITLE : Homeless, H²

DESCRIPTION

The idea of H² is to provide shelter and job opportunity to the homeless. Therefore, H² modular designed to have sleeping space and working space back to back where sleeping space is facing the back for better privacy while working space is facing the main road to gain maximum exposure for better interaction and business opportunity.

Homeless community is designated in between the LRT columns, filling the urban lost space. It is a platform for the homeless to encourage each other and regain their self-confidences. It is also a platform to reduce social barrier between the public and homeless.

H² is a sustainable modular. It is made from standard size, light weight, less maintenance and durable materials to ensure quicker and lower cost construction. H² community adopted rain water harvesting system, translucent skin of individual modular reduces the dependency of street light and provide better surveillance at surrounding.
