The 2016 “Foundations and Futures” symposium will serve as the kickoff for the J. Irwin and Xenia S. Miller Prize Competition, the central component of the 2017 symposium and exhibition. Through a juried competition, Miller Prizes will be awarded to five finalists who will each design, build, and install temporary projects in response to one of five Columbus icons.

About Exhibit Columbus

Exhibit Columbus is an annual exploration of architecture, art, design, and community with programming that alternates between symposium and exhibition years. With more than 70 notable buildings, landscapes, and public art installations by world-renowned architects and artists, such as Eliel and Eero Saarinen, Harry Weese, Dan Kiley, Kevin Roche, I.M. Pei, Alexander Girard, Henry Moore, Michael Van Valkenburgh, and Jean Tinguely, Columbus is ranked with New York and Chicago as one of the most important American cities for modern architecture, design, and art.

With an inaugural symposium in fall of 2016 and a first exhibition in fall of 2017, Exhibit Columbus seeks to celebrate Columbus’ design heritage while making it relevant to new audiences. The initial program will be followed by another symposium and exhibition in 2018 and 2019, creating a new and ambitious cycle of events.

The 2017 exhibition will focus on site-responsive installations that connect with and comment on Columbus’ design legacy. Programming for Exhibit Columbus will occur downtown in the Columbus Arts and Entertainment District and attract world-renowned designers, historians, and fabricators, while at the same time re-energizing the community around its historic design heritage and the potential to realize new designs.
